Port of Blyth - East Pier Lighthouse

This landmark, sits at the end of the east pier in Blyth, was built in 1907 and aids ships entering Blyth Harbour.

C&D Access were tasked to restore the lighthouse providing a suitable method and applying selected material's, taking into consideration its contemporary criteria of conservation and to recover & preserve its original characteristics.

The restoration project was carried out by a six man team over a 12 day period, and was carried out by descending down the lighthouse on ropes.

Services

Painting of Blyth Pier lighthouse by means of rope access;

- 1. Mechanical preparation and painting of external doors.*
- 2. Small render repairs and belzona repairs on heavily corroded steel work.*
- 3. Mechanical preparation of heavily corroded steelwork and painting (2 Coat System).*
- 4. Over plating of rear external door and painting.*
- 5. Mechanical prep and painting of upper handrails on lighthouse and also on perimeter rails.*
- 6. Removal of external ladder and heavily corroded steel work.*
- 7. Replacing upper door locking mechanism.*
- 8. Fitting of anti-climbing stega strips (15m).*
- 9. Painting of lighthouse structure.*
